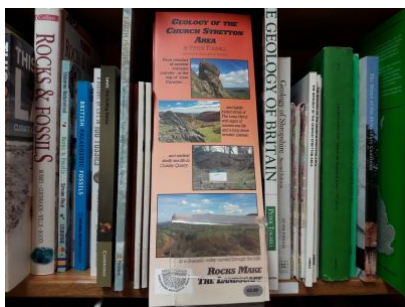

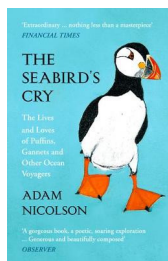

WAINWRIGHT BOOK PRIZE

Congratulations to Adam Nicolson on winning the Wainwright Book Prize for nature writing with *The Seabird's Cry*.



Adam Nicolson has been in love with seabirds all his life: for their mastery of wind and ocean, their aerial beauty and the unmatched wildness of the coasts and islands where every summer they return to breed. In ten chapters, each dedicated to a different bird, and each beautifully illustrated by Kate Boxer, *The Seabird's Cry* travels the ocean paths along with them, looking at the way their bodies work, the sense of their own individuality, the strategies and tactics needed to survive and thrive in the most demanding environment on earth. His book is also a record and a warning of a global tragedy in the making. Even as we are coming to understand them, the number of seabirds is in freefall, dropping by nearly 70% in the last sixty years, a billion fewer now than there were in 1950.

Launched in the USA in 1982 in response to a sudden surge in attempts to have books removed or restricted from schools, bookshops and libraries, Banned Books Week celebrates literature that has experienced bans or censorship worldwide. Some of the best known banned books are *The Satanic Verses* by Salman Rushdie, *Brave New World* by Aldous Huxley, *Beloved* by Toni Morrison, *Doctor Zhivago* by Boris Pasternak, *Lady Chatterley's Lover* by D. H. Lawrence, *The Handmaid's Tale* by Margaret Atwood.
