Simon gave a fascinating on how he came to write the Mortiforde Mysteries which are set in a fictional town which maybe in South Shropshire?

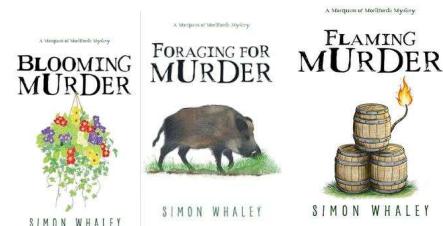
With Bonfire Night looming, Aldermaston, the Eighth Marquess of Mortiforde, is feeling the heat.

Son of Nobody by Yann Martel

We have been waiting awhile for this novel by Life of Pi author Yann Martel. This is an extraordinary novel and well worth the wait....

In the depths of the Bodleian Library, Harlow discovers a lost account of the Trojan War, a glimpse into the founding of Western civilization itself. He names the epic poem The Psoad, after its protagonist, a Greek commoner identified as Psoas of Midea but known to all as 'son of nobody'. As sole translator and interpreter of the Psoad, Harlow dedicates the poem and its footnotes to his daughter, Helen.

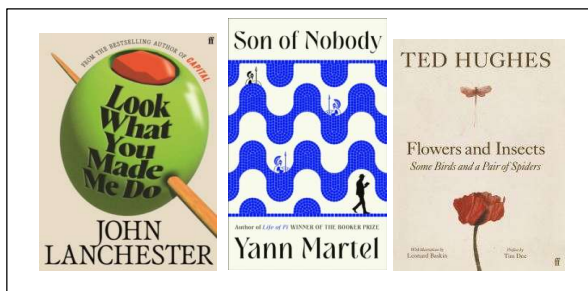
Look What You Made Me Do by John Lanchester

A black comedy of resentment and entitlement, *Look What You Made Me Do* is the story of two very different women from two very different generations, heading toward a battle only one of them can win.
